

AFAP SUCCESS STORIES

- Service members' Group Life Insurance (SGLI) increased from \$50,000 to 400,000.
- A vehicle can be stored at government expense when a Soldier is re-assigned to an area where shipment isn't authorized.
- Family Separation Allowance was increased from \$75 to \$250.00 per month.
- Programs like Army Family Team Building (AFTB) and Better Opportunities for Single Soldiers (BOSS) were born.
- Army Emergency Relief (AER) provides grants in overseas locations to assist with financial aid for spouses to pursue undergraduate, vo-technical, high school completeness, and English as a Second Language studies.

What is AFAP Army Family Action Plan

The Army Family Action Plan (AFAP) is input from the people of the Army to Army Leadership. It is a process that lets Soldiers and Families say what's working' and what isn't AND what they think will fix it.

AFAP alerts Commanders and Army leaders to areas of concern that need their attention and it identifies issues of concern to the total Army Family.

AFAP determines actions necessary to resolve issues and assigns responsibility for actions to the proper Army staff agency.
