HUNTING, TRAPPING, AND FISHING REGULATION

History. This is a revised publication.

Summary. Joint Readiness Training Center (JRTC) and Fort Polk (FP) Regulation 210-18 prescribes rules, policies, and regulations for hunting, fishing, trapping, and wildlife conservation on the Fort Polk Military Reservation (including Peason Ridge) under the provisions of Army Regulation (AR) 420-74 and in accordance with federal and state game laws and regulations. Persons violating this regulation or federal or state game laws will be subject to suspension or revocation of hunting, trapping, and fishing privileges and/or disciplinary action. Violation of hunting, trapping, and fishing regulations is punishable under federal or state law.

Applicability. This regulation applies to all Department of Defense (DOD) employees, military or civilian, assigned, or attached to the JRTC and Fort Polk, units and activities within the Fort Polk area, and any hunters, fishers, and conservationists, who hunt, fish, or conserve wildlife on the Fort Polk Military Reservation (including Peason Ridge). The pronouns he, his, and him when used in this regulation are intended to include both the masculine and feminine genders. Any exceptions will be so noted.

Proponent and Exception Authority. The proponent agency for this regulation is the Provost Marshal Office (PMO). The proponent has the authority to approve exceptions to this regulation that are consistent with controlling law and regulation.

Supplementation. Supplementation and establishment of command publications and local forms are prohibited without prior approval from the Directorate of Information Management (DOIM), Administrative Services Division, Building 330, Suite 111, 1820 Corps Road, Fort Polk, Louisiana 71459-0908.

Suggested Improvements. Users of JRTC & FP Regulation 210-18 are invited to send comments and suggested improvements on Recommended Changes

Distribution. Distribution of this publication is made in accordance with JRTC & FP Circular 25-30, Distribution Formulas, intended for command level A+; DOIM, Publications Control-4, Stockroom-150; and Provost Marshal Office-25.

1. Purpose. Joint Readiness Training Center and FP Regulation 210-18 prescribes rules, policies, and regulations for hunting, fishing, trapping, and wildlife conservation on the Fort Polk Military Reservation (including Peason Ridge) under the provisions of AR 420-74 and in accordance with federal and state game laws and regulations. Persons violating this regulation or federal or state game laws

will be subject to suspension or revocation of hunting, trapping, and fishing privileges and/or disciplinary action. Violation of hunting, trapping, and fishing regulations is punishable under federal or state law.

2. References.

- a. Louisiana Hunting, Fishing, Trapping, and Motorboat Regulations.
- b. AR 200-3, Natural Resources-Land, Forest and Wildlife Management.

3. Responsibilities.

a. *G3/Directorate of Plans, Training, Mobilization, and Security (G3/DPTMS)*. The G3/DPTMS, Range Division will:

(1) Prepare daily hunting maps for Fort Polk and Peason Ridge that will include the areas open for hunting. Closed areas indicated on the map will include, as a minimum, a 300-meter safety zone during other hunting seasons.

(2) Prepare hunting maps in duplicate. Signature and date-time group will be entered by the preparer at the bottom right margin. The period for which the map is valid will be placed at the top right margin by the preparer. The Range Division will notify the Provost Marshal, Game Enforcement Section, telephone number 531-5715/5255, when the maps are ready.

(3) Ensure map preparation and PMO, Game Enforcement Section, notification is accomplished by 1000, the day prior to the date for which the map is valid.

(4) Coordinate the use between military needs and hunting, fishing, and trapping in a manner to fully satisfy the military needs while at the same time providing maximum utilization of the areas for hunting, fishing, and trapping.

(5) Ensure the PMO, Game Enforcement Section is notified of the cancellation or early completion of scheduled training activities.

b. *PMO*. The PMO will:

(1) Have overall staffing responsibility for the Fort Polk Hunting, Trapping, and Fishing Program.

(2) Designate an Installation Hunt Control Officer, who will be assigned to the Game

(a) Coordinate, administer, and supervise the Installation's Hunting, Trapping, and Fishing Program.

(b) Conduct a voluntary Hunter Safety Certification Program for interested hunters. All persons born on or after 1 September 1969 must show proof of satisfactorily completing a Hunter Safety Course, approved by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries, in order to purchase a basic hunting license.

(c) Ensure installation hunting, trapping, and fishing registration is not completed until the applicant is in compliance with Louisiana state licensing requirements and installation regulations, as appropriate.

(d) Organize an effective Law Enforcement Program for on-post fish and wildlife management in accordance with AR 200-3.

(e) Develop and maintain an effective working relationship with the U.S. Forestry Service; Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries; Directorate of Public Works (DPW), Environmental and Natural Resources Management Division; G3/DPTMS; and civilian law enforcement agencies.

(f) Ensure that signed and dated hunting maps are picked up from G3/DPTMS, Range Division and copies prepared for self-clearing stations and information points. The maps will be posted NO LATER THAN 1530 on the day that the map is received.

(g) Closely coordinate with DPW, Environmental and Natural Resources Management Division, to specifically ensure that enforcement of rules and regulations is adequately addressed in the cooperative agreement with federal and state wildlife law officials.

(h) Maintain an alphabetical file listing of personnel registered to hunt, fish, and/or trap on the installation and provide each with a copy of the Sportsmen Information Handout (Appendix A). The file will consist of a separate card with each registrant's name, signature, address, phone number, installation registration number, state license number, Hunter/Safety Certification Program overstamp, if applicable, and date of issue. Each registrant will receive a portion of the registration to be carried on the registrant's person and vehicle as field certification of registration, which will contain the registrant's printed name, registration number, and date of issue.

(i) Conduct in-service training of assigned Game Enforcement Section personnel to include basic first aid, hunter safety, and fish and game laws.

(j) Plan, coordinate, and supervise special operations to include stake-out and joint air-ground operations with state, federal, local, and military agencies as required to enforce federal, state, and installation hunting, trapping, and fishing regulations.

(k) Ensure that assigned enforcement personnel record the hunting permit registration number of all persons checked in the field.

(l) Ensure that section and other law enforcement personnel are prepared and present for scheduled court appearances.

(m) Supervise animal control for Fort Polk Reservation and Peason Ridge.

(n) Ensure that centralized check-in/out is in effect during either-sex deer hunting days.

(o) Ensure that check-in/out cards are removed on a daily basis from self-clearing stations and provided to the Natural Resources Management Division.

(p) Supervise preparation of applicable Military Police Reports (DA Form 3975) by military and civilian Game Warden enforcement personnel.

c. *Directorate of Public Works.* The Chief, DPW, Environmental and Natural Resources Management Division, will:

(1) As directed by AR 200-3, be responsible for habitat management and the wildlife management portion of the Natural Resources Management Plan. Enter Fort Polk into a cooperative management agreement with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Forestry Service, and Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries.

(2) Coordinate with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, U.S. Forestry Service, and Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries in technical aspects of habitat management and coordinate setting of harvest regulations.

(3) Compile statistics on hunter participation and game bagged.

(4) Periodically review and coordinate update of Fort Polk Hunting, Trapping, and Fishing Regulations, as required, to ensure compliance with state and federal regulations and administrative regulations established by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries.

(5) Coordinate yearly update of hunting maps.

4. Eligibility. All persons may fish and hunt in areas open to hunting, trapping, and/or fishing on

Fort Polk and Peason Ridge, when the requirements of this regulation and the licensing requirements established by federal and Louisiana laws have been met.

5. Hunting Areas, Permits, and Clearances.

a. The portions of the areas open to hunting and fishing are shown on the current editions of the official hunting maps. All sportsmen must be familiar with this current map; handout maps will be provided for use as a reference. Self-Clearing Stations will be annotated on the handout map.

b. All hunters, trappers, and fishermen must check in and out each day. When JRTC rotations are not in progress, all Self-Clearing Stations will be open on Fort Polk and Peason Ridge. During rotations, a more centralized system will be used to check in/out of the area. Self-Clearing Stations #1 and #8 on Fort Polk will be utilized, and at Peason Ridge, the Self-Clearing Station at Highway 392 and Perimeter Road and the Peason Ridge Cantonment Station, Bldg PR100, will be open.

c. Daily permits will be issued by the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries for hunting during the either-sex gun deer season; successful hunters are required to take their deer to a weighing station prior to check-out during either-sex gun deer season. Location of the either-sex permit stations on Fort Polk are as follows:

(1) Game Enforcement Office, Bldg 7803, North Fort Polk.

(2) State Wildlife Office, Lookout Road.

(3) Fullerton Road at Highway 399. Locations for Peason Ridge either-sex permit stations are Highway 392 at perimeter road and the Peason Ridge Cantonment Station, Bldg PR100.

6. Fishing.

a. No registration is required to fish in Alligator Lake, Marion Bonner Lake, or Blue Hole Lake, when state licensing requirements are met.

b. In accordance with the provisions of paragraph 5b above, all persons fishing on reservation waters, other than Alligator Lake, Marion Bonner Lake, and Blue Hole Lake, must examine the current military-use map at the Game Enforcement Office, Bldg 7803, North Fort Polk, to determine the areas open to fishing and then sign in on the sheet provided for that purpose.

c. No check-out is required following fishing.

7. Trapping.

- a. Fur trapping, as prescribed by state law and wildlife management area regulations, will be available on the military reservation.
- b. Trappers must register at the Game Enforcement Office, Bldg 7803, North Fort Polk, and must check in/out through the Self-Clearing Stations.
- c. During trapping season, areas open to trapping will be marked on the daily hunting map that is posted at all Self-Clearing Stations.

8. Closed Areas.

- a. Hunters entering Army reservation lands that are closed to hunting, fishing, and trapping will be cited for violation of the rules and regulations of the Wildlife Management Area (LA R.S. 56).
- b. Areas closed to hunting, fishing, and trapping will be clearly marked on the official daily hunting map compiled by the G3/DPTMS, Range Division.
- c. Some areas permanently closed to gun hunting will be opened for the hunting of deer with legal archery equipment and will be marked on the official daily hunting map. A special registration will be required for bow hunting in these areas and special check-in/out cards issued and required to assist in data gathering.
- d. Some areas permanently closed to gun hunting will be opened on a periodic basis for the taking of small game or turkey. Hunters will use shotguns with shot not larger than number 2. These areas will be marked on the official daily hunting map.
- e. Impact areas that are permanently closed will be clearly delineated on all maps. All personnel are strictly prohibited from entering these areas.
- f. Deer hunters using firearms are prohibited from hunting within 300 meters (330 yards) of paved roads, occupied buildings, closed areas, and Lookout Road between Louisiana Highways 399 and 463 and the Peason Ridge perimeter road.
- g. Small game hunters, turkey hunters, and deer hunters using archery equipment are prohibited from hunting within 100 meters (110 yards) of specified roads, occupied buildings, and closed areas.

9. Weapons Registration/Transportation.

- a. For non-military personnel and military personnel not living on Fort Polk or in government quarters, the regulations pertinent to hunting do not require the registration of firearms brought on Fort Polk or Peason Ridge solely for hunting during open seasons.

- b. For military personnel living on Fort Polk or in government quarters, JRTC & Fort Polk Regulation

190-3 requires personnel register all weapons brought on Fort Polk (see reference paragraph le). Personnel living off post in non-government quarters are not required to register weapons.

- c. While being transported in vehicles, firearms will be separated from ammunition and will be outside the immediate reach and inaccessible to the driver and all occupants of the vehicle. At no time will weapons be transported under the driver's seat or in a console between the driver's and passenger's seat.

10. Animal Vaccination. All dogs used for hunting must be vaccinated against rabies. Dogs brought on the military reservation for hunting must wear a current rabies vaccination tag and/or the hunter must have in his possession written proof of such vaccination.

11. Prohibitions. Prohibited activities are as follows:

- a. Overnight camping on Fort Polk or Peason Ridge.
- b. Use of military weapons or ammunition for hunting.
- c. Hunting for any game while a gun season for deer is in progress without a minimum of 400 square inches of "hunter's orange" displayed on the body above the waist.
- d. Target shooting or indiscriminate discharge of firearms in hunting areas.
- e. Persons 17 years of age and younger hunting on Fort Polk and Peason Ridge unless they are in a party containing at least one adult 18 years of age or older.
- f. The placing of any type "bait" intended to entice game into a certain location or area for the purpose of taking game; hogs included.

12. Suspension/Revocation Of Privileges.

- a. An individual, upon receiving a citation issued by a Game Warden (civilian or military) for a violation of federal, state, or installation hunting, fishing or trapping regulation, will be required to appear before the Federal Magistrate, Fort Polk, Louisiana or other federal authority, as designated.
- b. Persons cited for unsafe acts (e.g., indiscriminate discharge of firearms, target shooting, hunting within buffer zone or closed area, failure to check in, and use of unauthorized firearms), or receiving a hunting citation, may have their Fort

Polk/Peason Ridge hunting privileges suspended.

- c. Persons committing offenses outlined in Appendix B will have their Fort Polk privileges revoked by the Provost Marshal. Violators will have

their hunting/fishing permit confiscated on the spot and be issued a citation. The permit will be reissued upon completion of the suspension period or as directed by the Garrison Commander.

d. The Provost Marshal is responsible for initiating action as the designee of the commander for restricting self-clearing privileges and for suspension/revocation of hunting privileges. All appeals will be made to the Garrison Commander.

e. Persons who have their installation hunting privileges suspended or revoked must submit, in writing, through the Provost Marshal Office to the Garrison Commander, a request for reinstatement of hunting privileges on Peason Ridge and the Fort Polk Military Reservation.

Appendix A Information For Hunting, Fishing, and Trapping for Fort Polk and Peason Ridge Wildlife Management Areas Sportsman Information

(Hand Out)

1. Introduction.

a. The Fort Polk Military Reservation, which includes the Peason Ridge Training Area, is used by the Department of Defense primarily for military training. Hunting, fishing, trapping, and other forms of outdoor recreation are permitted to the fullest extent to which the military mission allows access to the area.

b. Due to the long history of military use, it is possible that unexploded ordnance (duds) may be encountered anywhere in the area. While greater concentrations are mapped as Impact Areas and are marked "Off Limits" to all persons, one should nonetheless be very careful anytime he is in the field. He will not pick up any kind of ordnance that he encounters; he will report such encounters, to include specific location, to the PMO, Game Enforcement Section, as soon as possible (telephone 531-5715/5255).

c. Compliance with state and federal regulations, as well as JRTC & FP Reg 210-18, is required for all users of these areas.

JRTC & FP Reg 210-18

2. Revocation of Privileges.

a. An individual, upon receiving a hunting citation issued by a Game Warden (military or civilian) for violation of federal, state, or installation hunting, trapping, or fishing regulations, will be required to

pay a fine or appear before the Federal Magistrate, Fort Polk, Louisiana, or other federal court as designated.

b. Persons receiving a hunting citation will have their hunting privileges suspended by the Provost Marshal. Violation of the suspension will result in a revocation. All appeals will be made to the Garrison Commander.

c. Persons failing to comply with the self-clearing check-in/out procedures (when in effect) will temporarily lose their self-clearing privileges. In order to hunt, fish, or trap during this period of restriction, those persons will be required to check in and out with the PMO, Game Enforcement Office, Bldg 7803. Violation of the restriction may result in the suspension of hunting privileges. Subsequent violations of the self-clearing restriction and/or suspension will result in the revocation of hunting privileges for the remainder of the hunting season.

d. The Provost Marshal is responsible for initiating action as designee of the commander for restricting self-clearing privileges and for suspension or revocation of post hunting privileges.

e. Persons who have their installation hunting privileges suspended or revoked must submit, in writing through the PMO to the Garrison Commander, a request for reinstatement of hunting privileges on the Fort Polk installation.

f. Listed below are some examples of violations that could result in suspension of hunting privileges. See Appendix B for an extensive list of additional violations.

(1) Hunting within 300 meters (rifle) or 100 meters (shotgun or bow) of paved roads, occupied buildings, closed areas, and Lookout Road between Louisiana Highways 399 and 463 and the Peason Ridge perimeter road.

(2) Target shooting or indiscriminate weapon discharge.

(3) Not wearing 400 square inches of hunter's orange during gun season for deer.

(4) Hunting from a vehicle, parked or moving.

(5) Hunting out of season.

(6) Failure to check in/out.

(7) Using illegal weapons; e.g., unplugged shotgun, fully automatic shotgun/rifle, military weapon, etc.

3. Registration.

a. In order to hunt, fish, or trap on Fort Polk or Peason Ridge, one must register at the PMO, Game Enforcement Office, Bldg 7803, North Fort Polk.

b. Registration is valid for the entire season from

1 September through 31 August. When hunting on either Wildlife Management Area, a copy of this registration must be on the individual at all times and a vehicle display card will be placed in the hunter's windshield. (Vehicle display cards are issued when a person registers and are good all season.)

c. Installation registration is not required to fish in Alligator Lake, Marion Bonner Lake, or Blue Hole Lake; however, one must have a valid Louisiana State fishing license, if required.

d. Prior to fishing in any area, except Alligator, Marion Bonner, and Blue Hole Lakes, one must check the current map of restricted areas posted at the PMO, Game Enforcement Office, Bldg 7803.

e. Prior to hunting in any area during rotation, hunters must centrally check in/out at the PMO, Game Enforcement Office, Bldg 7803; Self-Clearing Stations #1 and #8 on Fort Polk; at Peason Ridge, the Self-Clearing Station at Highway 392 and Perimeter Road; and the Peason Ridge Cantonment Station, Bldg PR100. They should take a map from the map case and mark the restricted areas for personal reference.

f. If the date selected to hunt is not during rotations, then self-clearing is in effect. Begin the hunt by completing a check-in card and deposit it in the box marked for that purpose at any of the eight check-in/out stations on Fort Polk; if hunting is Peason Ridge, four stations as indicated on the Peason Ridge hunting map. Upon completion of the hunt, hunters must check out by completing both sides of a check-out card at any of the eight check-in/out stations.

g. Fort Polk registration and appropriate Louisiana State license must be carried at all times while in the field.

4. Non-Game Wildlife and Dogs.

a. Explanation of Term. Non-game wildlife includes all wild animals not classified as game (LA R.S. 56).

b. Of the non-game vertebrate wildlife, only poisonous snakes may be killed.

c. Armadillos may be taken for food by legally authorized hunters, when other hunting seasons are in progress.

d. Coyotes may be shot for the pelts only when other hunting seasons are in progress.

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e. Unmarked hogs may be taken from Peason Ridge and/or Fort Polk during the "gun" deer season and by licensed archers during the archery deer season.

f. Handguns of .22 caliber centerfire or larger are legal for hunting deer or unmarked hogs during the gun deer season.

5. Basic Rules/Information.

a. No camping is allowed on the military reservation or Peason Ridge. Two U.S. Forestry Service camping areas are available to hunters using Fort Polk (see map). The U.S. Forestry Service lands in Natchitoches Parish are available for Peason Ridge hunters to camp on.

b. Pick up a free copy of Louisiana hunting, fishing, trapping, and motorboat regulations at Bldg 7803, North Fort Polk. Carefully read the section on Wildlife Management Area regulations and the Fort Polk-Peason Ridge Wildlife Management Area regulations before hunting.

The records of this office indicate that on _____ you were cited for a hunting/fishing violation. Under the provisions of JRTC and Fort Polk Regulation 210-18, your hunting/fishing privileges on Fort Polk, Louisiana are immediately suspended for _____ months.

Additionally, if you hunt/fish on Fort Polk while under suspension, your privileges on Fort Polk will be revoked for _____.

If you wish to appeal, sign the acknowledgement below and return the original copy of this letter to arrive at the Provost Marshal Office no later than 5 working days after you receive this letter. The Provost Marshal Office will notify you of the date, time, and place of your hearing. You must also possess a valid state hunting license.

Even if you do not wish to appeal, you must sign the acknowledgement below and return the original copy

of this letter promptly to the Provost Marshal Office.

NOTE

A person committing more than one offense may have his/her hunting/fishing privileges suspended for a period equal to the total of standard penalties for each offense. In the event that the total period of suspension is in excess of 1 year, the person's privileges may be permanently revoked.

If you wish to have your installation hunting/fishing privileges restored upon completion of your term of suspension/revocation or if you request an appeal, you must submit a written request to the Provost Marshal Office, ATTN: Suspension Revocation Clerk.
